Purpose

The fund will be used to deposit fees received from document searches, Social Security, Vital Statistics and other State Registrar programs. The funds will be used to administer the existing State Registrar Program and any related newly created programs.

Administering Agency/Organization Code

Department of Public Health/Org 4265

Major Revenue Source

(1) Fees charged for record searches, issuance of certificates, permit registrations or other documents, (2) funds from the Social Security Administration for the enumeration birth program, (3) funds from the Vital Statistics Cooperative Program, (4) funds transferred from the Vital Records Improvement Account (0137) and (5) other state register funds except those fees specifically allocated per Section 102247.

Disposition of Fund (upon abolishment)

Pursuant to Government Code section 16346, absent language that identifies a successor fund, any balance remaining in this fund upon abolishment, shall be transferred to the General Fund.

Appropriation Authority

This fund is available upon appropriation by the Legislature

State Appropriations Limit

Excluded- Revenues in this fund are not proceeds of taxes, however, when transferred, may become proceeds of taxes. These revenues are used to provide direct services or products to the payers.

Comments/Historical Information

Chapter 492, Statutes of 1994 originally created the Health Statistics Special Fund. The fund was abolished and Health and Safety Code section 10000 was repealed in Chapter 415, Statutes of 1995, Section 125.

Original Administrative Organization Code 4260 was changed to 4265 due to the Department of Health Services splitting into two departments effective July 2007 according to Chapter 241, statutes of 2006 SB162.

Health and Safety Code section 102247 has a repeal date of January 1, 2018, unless a later enacted statute deletes or extends that date.
